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SPECIFICATION FOR DISPOSABLE POLYSTYRENE CUTLERY

FOREWORD

This Singapore Standard was prepared by the Technical Committee on Specification for Disposable Polystyrene Cutlery under the authority of the Packaging Materials Product Standards Committee.

The standard applies to disposable polystyrene cutlery which have direct contact with food. It seeks to define the chemical, toxicity and performance criteria of the products.

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1. SCOPE

This standard specifies material and performance requirements for disposable polystyrene cutlery which are intended for use in contact with food and drinks up to a maximum service temperature of 100°C. The disposable items which are for one time usage include knives, forks, spoons and stirrers.

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
