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SPECIFICATION FOR REFINED AND DEODORIZED PALM OLEIN

FOREWORD

This Singapore Standard was drawn up by the Technical Committee on Edible Fats and Oils under the direction of the Food Standards Committee.

It is a revision of SS 182: 1978 on Specification for Refined, Bleached and Deodorized Palm Olein. The revision resulted in major changes to the technical requirements in the standard in line with international requirements and trade practices.
