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Foreword

This Technical Reference was prepared by a Working Group appointed by the Technical Committee on Construction Management under the direction of the Building and Construction Standards Committee (BCSC). The BCSC endorsed the TR on behalf of the Singapore Standards Council on 14 October 2014.

The Technical Reference is intended to provide recommended practices on the design, management, maintenance and operation of foreign workers' dormitories. Well-constructed, tidy and well-managed dormitories help provide its residents with a hygienic, conducive and safe place to reside.

This Technical Reference is not to be regarded as a Singapore Standard. This Technical Reference is made available for provisional application over a period of two years, but does not have the status of a Singapore Standard. The aim is to use the experience gained to modify the Technical Reference so that it can be adopted as a Singapore Standard. Users of the Technical Reference are invited to comment on its technical content, ease of use and any ambiguities or anomalies. These comments can be submitted using the feedback form provided at the end of the Technical Reference and will be taken into account in the review of the publication. At the end of the two years, the Technical Reference will be reviewed by the WG to discuss the comments received and to determine its suitability as a Singapore Standard. Submission for approval by the Standards Council as a Singapore Standard will be carried out only upon agreement after review.

In preparing the Technical Reference, the Working Group has incorporated relevant inputs from the Building and Construction Authority (BCA), Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF), National Environment Agency (NEA), Ministry of Manpower (MOM), PUB, the National Water Agency (PUB), Urban Redevelopment Authority (URA), Singapore Police Force (SPF), Housing & Development Board (HDB), Land Transport Authority (LTA) and the Dormitory Association of Singapore Limited (DASL).

It shall be limited to the design, management, maintenance and operation of purpose-built foreign workers' dormitories.
