1. SCOPE

This specification covers scouring powder for the cleaning of porcelain faces (vitreous types), floors, marble and for general kitchen use.

2. CLASSIFICATION

The scouring powder covered by this specification shall be of the following types:

Type I — with chlorine-containing bleaching agent

Type II — without chlorine-containing bleaching agent
