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Foreword

This Technical Reference (TR) was prepared by the Working Group on Hotel Internship set up by the Technical Committee on Hotel Services under the purview of SvSC.

The hotel and accommodation services sector is a key pillar of the Singapore's hospitality industry. It supports Singapore's position as a business hub and fuels growth in related industries, such as retail and food and beverage services. This sector is a major employer in the hospitality industry.

For the hotels and accommodation services, internship programme is an opportunity to identify, attract and retain suitable candidates for full-time employment. At the same time, the organisations may profile and brand themselves as an employer-of-choice, get fresh ideas and perspectives from the interns. This could also help to shape the interns' perception of the industry and the job, as well as to influence their decision to join this industry upon completion of their course.

This TR is a provisional standard made available for application over a period of three years. The aim is to use the experience gained to update the TR so that it can be adopted as a Singapore Standard. Users of the TR are invited to provide feedback on its technical content, clarity and ease of use. Feedback can be submitted using the form provided in the TR. At the end of the three years, the TR will be reviewed, taking into account any feedback or other considerations, to further its development into a Singapore Standard if found suitable.

This TR is expected to be used by the hotel and accommodation services industry, food and beverage industry, institutes of higher learning and the hospitality industry associations.

0 Introduction

This TR provides good practices to all stakeholders in the hotel and accommodation services sector on the development of a structured internship programme for students to have a meaningful and realistic experience in this industry.

This TR is also applicable to the food services sector.
