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#### **Foreword**

This Singapore Standard was prepared by the Working Group on Ceramic Wall and Floor Tiling set up by the Technical Committee on Architectural Works under the purview of BCSC.

This development of this Singapore Standard resulted from the review of CP 68:1997 – "Code of practice for ceramic wall and floor tiling". SS 665 replaces CP 68.

The key differences from CP 68 are as follows:

- (a) Adopting and harmonising with BS 5385-1 for internal wall tiling and BS 5385-3 for both internal and external floor tiling.
- (b) Aligning with local industrial practices such as the Construction Quality Assessment System (CONQUAS), including local terminologies.
- (c) Incorporating the latest recommendations and requirements for tile adhesives and tile grouts.
- (d) Incorporating recommendations made in the latest relevant local and overseas standards.

It is presupposed that in the course of their work, users will comply with all relevant regulatory and statutory requirements. Some examples of relevant regulations and acts are listed in the Bibliography. The Singapore Standards Council and Enterprise Singapore will not be responsible for identifying all of such legal obligations.

In preparing this standard, reference was made to the following publications:

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### Code of practice for ceramic wall and floor tiling

#### 1 Scope

This standard provides requirements for the design and installation of ceramic and mosaic floor and wall tiling in normal internal and external conditions. This standard also deals with classes and types of backgrounds and their suitability to receive tiling using the following fixing methods:

- (a) Bedding in cementitious adhesives on an intermediate substrate or as a direct bedding method.
- (b) Bedding in organic based adhesives (dispersion or reaction resin) on an intermediate substrate or as a direct bedding method.

This standard does not cover both the natural and agglomerated stone tiles. It also does not cover the design and installation of ceramic tiles in specific conditions such as in a swimming pool, and in situations where there are specific environmental or functional requirements, such as the need for a sterile environment and conditions that are potentially detrimental to either the installation or the background.
